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Xcel Energy files quarterly electricity, natural gas prices

First-quarter 2017 electric bills to be lower, natural gas bills higher for remainder of winter

DENVER, Colorado (Dec. 15, 2016) – Xcel Energy customers in Colorado will see a bump up in monthly natural gas bills during the first quarter of 2017 – similar to what is happening across the nation this winter heating season – but the increase will be partially offset by a decline in monthly electricity bills for the same period.

Based on filings made today with the Colorado Public Utilities Commission (CPUC), the proposed quarterly Gas Cost Adjustment (GCA) would result in natural gas bills of 13-14 percent higher, when compared to the first quarter of 2016.

Natural gas bills still are lower than a couple of years ago, based on continuing historically low natural gas prices. Customer bills next quarter will be about 11 percent less when compared to customer bills for the first quarter of 2015. Natural gas bills are compared on an annual basis to better reflect seasonal use.

The proposed quarterly Electric Commodity Adjustment (ECA) also filed today offsets some of the increase in natural gas bills for combined customers of Xcel Energy. Customer bills are expected to decrease by 2-3 percent, when compared with bills for the fourth quarter of 2016.

With minor exceptions, costs associated with increases or decreases through the ECA and GCA are passed along to customers on a dollar-per-dollar basis. If approved by the CPUC, new rates would go into effect on Jan. 1, 2017, to remain in effect for three months.
